## This Month's Beekeeping

It is vitally important to install entrance reducers (using the large opening) <u>now</u> to keep out mice. Mice will make a mess of the hive and, due to their disturbing the cluster, cause the bees to consume more honey during the winter.

By now your wintering preparations should be over. The cluster should be in the bottom box(es) and have frames of honey above it. If the hive is still light on honey stores, the bees can still take up sugar syrup from an internal or top feeder on warm days. Feeding 2:1 syrup is advised as it's easier for the bees to store (less water to evaporate) and will not ferment as rapidly.

Be sure to have some space for air to escape from the top of the hive so that condensation does not drip on the cluster. This will cause hyperthermia and the death of the hive.
