This Month's Beekeeping

For those of you who use Apistan, Apiguard, etc. now's the time to measure the number of mites in the hive (drop, sugar roll, etc) and treat only if necessary. Also feed 2:1 sugar syrup if stores are low. If you use strips, be sure to leave them in the hive only the length of time called for in the directions on the package.

Now is the time to do a complete hive inspection and position the bees/frames for the winter. Place all the brood in the bottom box with frames of honey above them. The frames above the bees are the most critical for over wintering as the bees can only move up. If you are using Mediums, you should have honey frames above the bees in both upper boxes. If you don't have 60-70 lbs. of honey, feed, feed, and feed.

It is vitally important to install entrance reducers (using the large opening) soon to keep out mice. Mice will make a mess of the hive and due to their disturbing the cluster, cause the bees to consume more honey during the winter.
