VSBA Spring Meeting Apr. 17-18

The VSBA Spring meeting on April 17-18 is fast approaching. In addition to the two-day meeting at the Northampton Community Center in Hampton, VA, Dr. Rick Fell and Keith Tignor are planning a pre-meeting workshop on queen rearing. The workshop will occur Thursday night, 4/16, and Friday morning, 4/17 at the Hampton Roads Agriculture Research and Extension Center. This is the site of one of the demonstration/research apiaries established last year to assist beekeepers in management practices. Participation in the workshop will be limited to 24. There is no fee to attend. We will begin the Thursday night session at 7:30 pm, ending at 10:00 pm, and cover the reproductive biology and production techniques of honeybee queen rearing. The Friday morning session will begin at 8:30 am, ending in time to allow everyone to attend the VSBA meeting. The morning session will consist of demonstrations of queen rearing techniques and opportunities for participants to practice some these techniques.

This Month's Beekeeping

The early trees are in bloom. Bradford pears and the ornamental fruit trees are out. The bees now have a natural source of pollen so they will not take pollen substitute, and syrup may not be eaten as fast. However, feeding syrup lets them eat at night when they are not flying. For those with package bees, don't stop feeding until they do not take up <u>any</u> syrup. Remember that more hives die in March than any other month as the food consumption ramps up due to brood rearing. Keep a close watch on your hives for the next 3 to 4 weeks.
